01. Vision

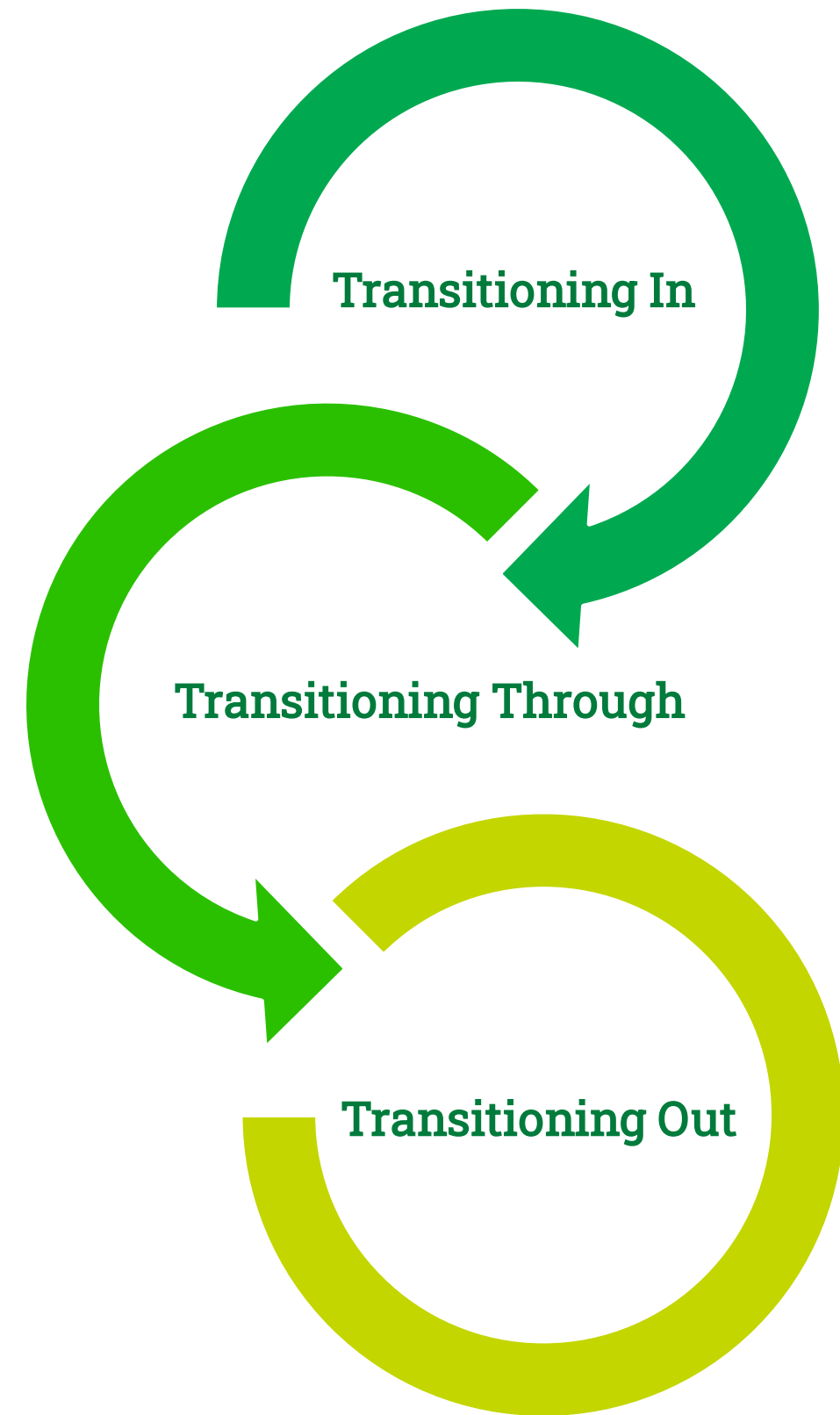

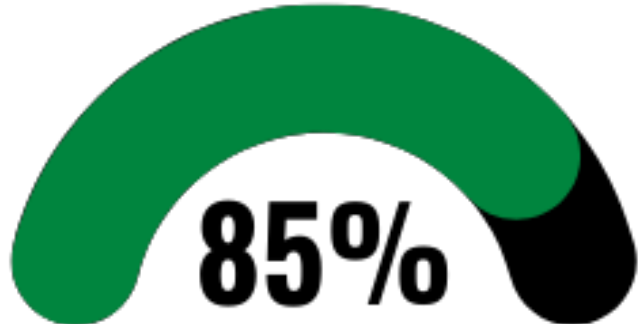

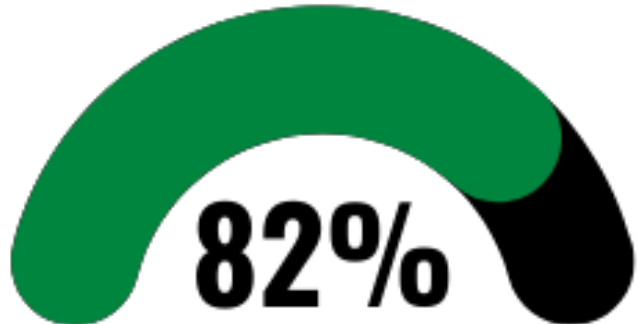

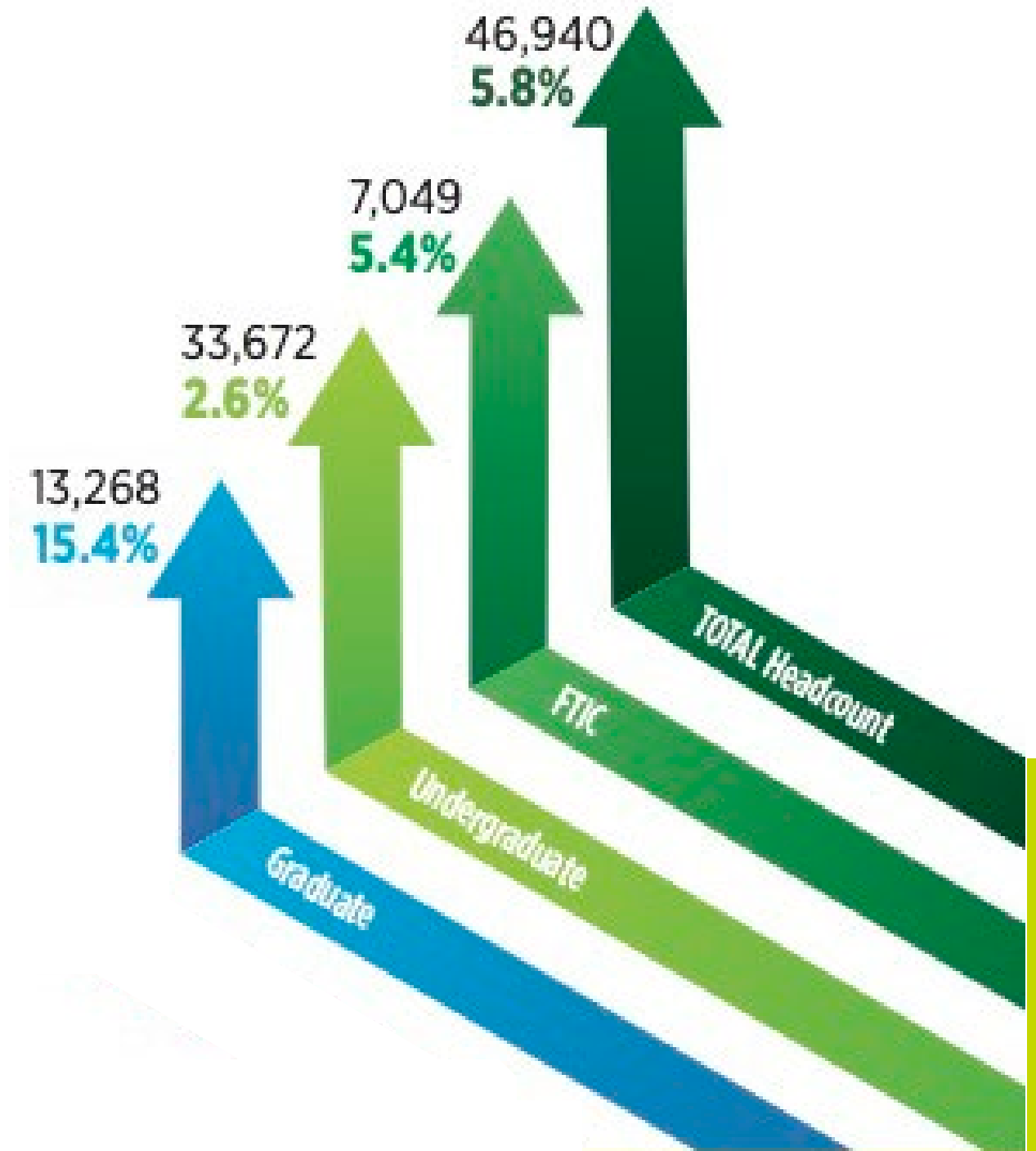

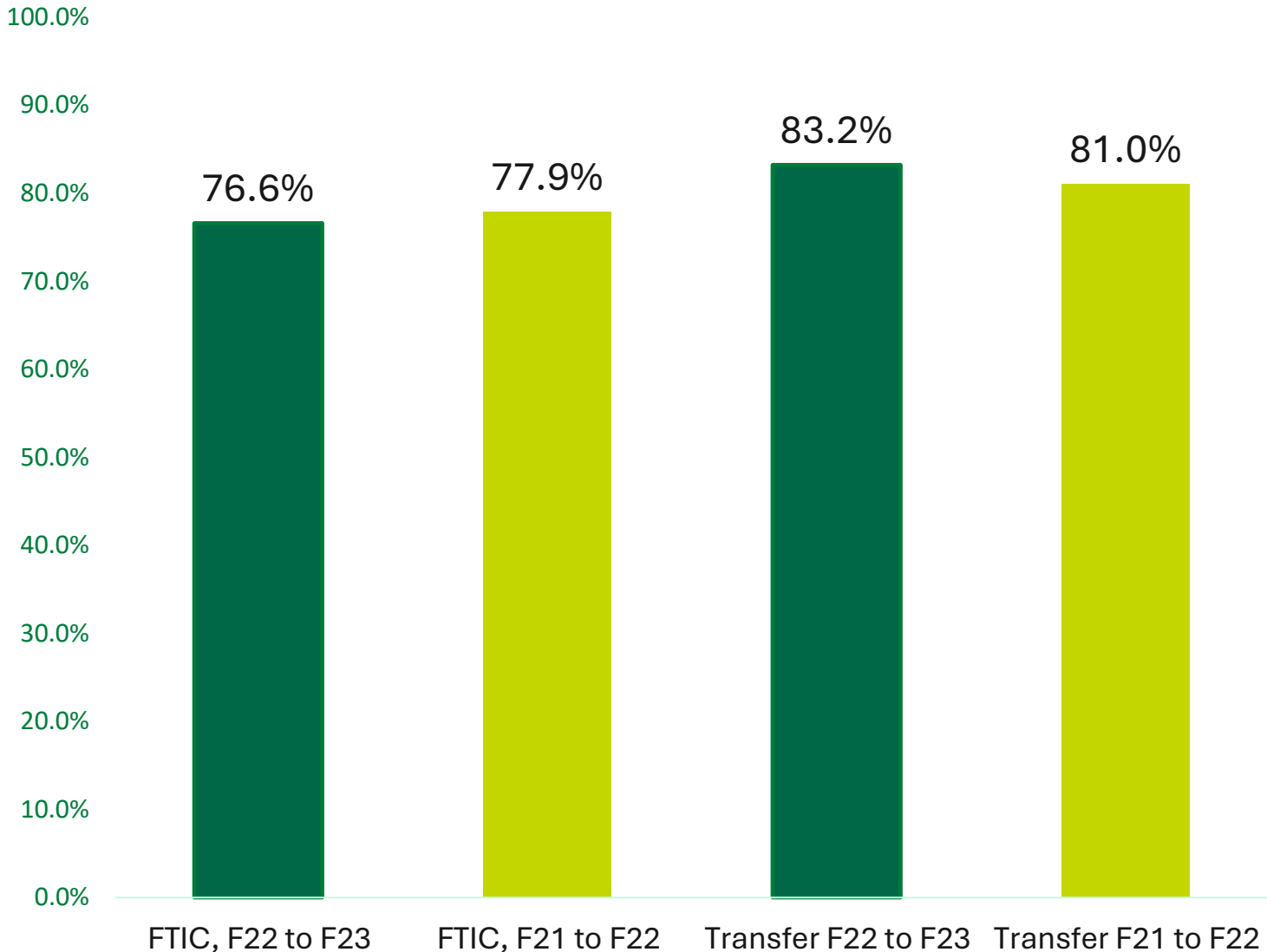

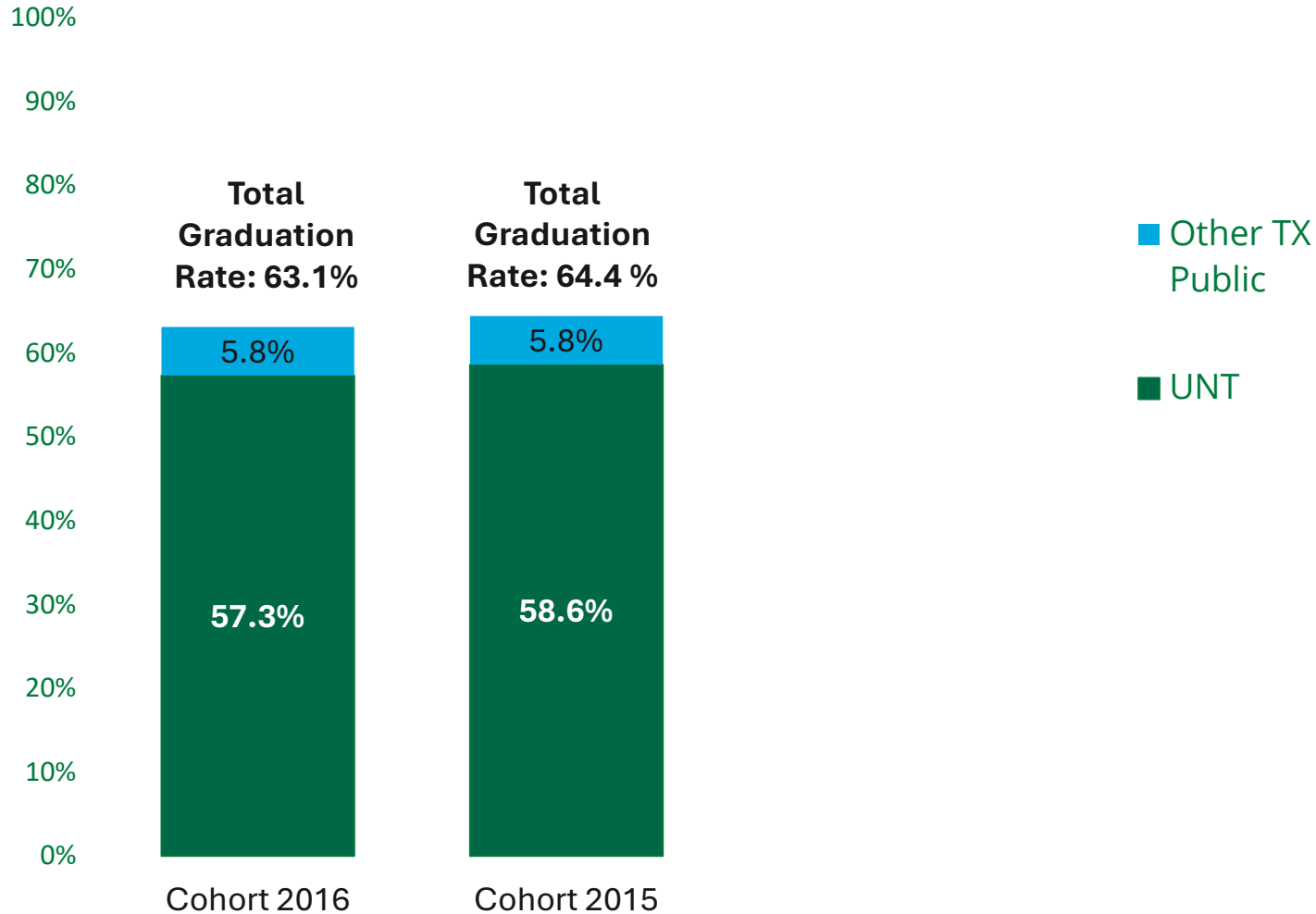
