

# BA IN FRENCH WITH ALL-LEVEL TEACHER CERTIFICATION DEGREE IN THREE ACADEMIC MAP

**2021-2022 CATALOG YEAR** 

A Bachelor of Arts with a major in French enables students (1) to understand, read, write, and speak the language they have chosen to study; (2) to gain, through the use of these language skills, a knowledge of the countries, regions, and peoples where that language is spoken; and (3) to develop an understanding of cultures and history of such regions. This degree provides training for teachers of French for the early childhood through high school grade levels.

A minimum GPA of 2.75 is required for overall, UNT, Teacher Education, and French course work, as well as a grade of C or higher in all French and Education courses.
