The Bachelor of Science with a major in Interdisciplinary Studies (with EC-6 or 4-8 teacher certification) develops highly qualified teachers through a rigorous curriculum with high standards. District administrators report that our graduates are as prepared in their first year of teaching as second- and third-year teachers.

This three-year plan provides a model for on-time completion of this UNT program. See the current *Undergraduate Catalog* for course prerequisites. Course availability at UNT is subject to change, and the plan shown below may change based on updates to UNT's course offerings.

Degree Requirements and Information

- Minimum Grades: Grade of C or above in all required courses.
- UNT GPA: Minimum 2.000 GPA on all course work at UNT.
- GPA (All Courses): Minimum 2.000 GPA, UNT and transfer hours included (minimum 2.750 GPA for Admission to Teacher Education).
- University Core GPA: Minimum 2.750 GPA required in completed University Core.
- Academic Major GPA: Minimum 2.750 GPA required in completed Academic Major.
- Student/Apprentice Teaching: Requires passing grade (P) for both Student/Apprentice Teaching courses.
- Total Hours: Minimum of 123 total hours, at least 31 hours earned in residence at UNT. Completion of minimum hours required for the degree does not guarantee completion of all degree requirements.
- Best Choices: Specific courses recommended in some core categories. Students may elect to take a different
 course listed under the University Core Curriculum to fulfill these requirements.

Admission to Teacher Education (TEd)

TEd admission is required to enroll in all courses shown in bold and designated with an asterisk (*).

- 1) For admission to TEd, a student must have on record in the College of Education Student Advising Office (COE-SAO):
 - □ 60+ earned credit hours (JR/SR Classification);
- □ Appropriate *ACT* or *SAT* scores, or TSI completion;

□ 2.75+ GPA (All Courses);

- ☐ Approved Interview Questionnaire email;
- □ 2.75+ GPA in completed University Core;
- ☐ Official degree audit (in progress or completed) in the COE-SAO, and active enrollment at UNT.
- 2) Once all six (6) requirements above are complete, schedule an appointment to submit an Application for Admission to UNT's Teacher Education Program.
- 3) A formal Offer of Admission letter is provided at the appointment or sent to your EagleConnect. UNT's offer must be Accepted within 72 hours of delivery.
- 4) Once the offer letter is accepted and on record in the COE-SAO, enrollment in TEd courses is permitted during a valid enrollment period.
