The Bachelor of Arts in International Studies with a Concentration in International Development & Humanitarian Affairs is an interdisciplinary major that explores a variety of issues often associated with the development of third world countries. Students are asked to choose a region that meets the criteria of being considered a third world region and a language that matches that region. For example, Africa & the Middle East for the region and either Arabic or French for the language.

In addition to required major courses, students will complete a total of 18 hours in their chosen language. In many cases, students are able to complete a minor in their chosen language by taking one more language course and earning grades of C or better in each class.

We encourage students to participate in Study Abroad programs when possible and especially to seek out and obtain internships. Several of our students have been lucky enough to do internships abroad and accomplish both simultaneously! Our alumni work in multiple related fields both nationally and internationally. They can be found in government, education, business, and the military. Students today will be global leaders tomorrow!
