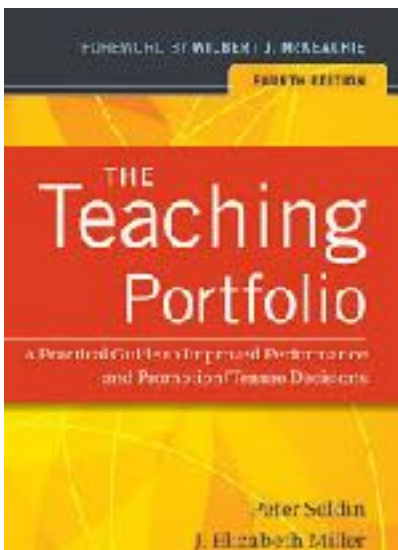

A teaching portfolio is made up of several components, including your teaching philosophy, responsibilities, methods, materials, innovations, curricular revisions, goals, summary of teaching effectiveness and relevant archival materials.

As an early career academic, understanding what a teaching portfolio is and how to efficiently and effectively assemble one will serve you throughout your career.



## Requirements of the MAY Teaching Portfolio Workshop

### *The Prep: May 1-14*

You will receive free access to The Teaching Portfolio e-book by Peter Seldin, as well as access to the Canvas course with a questionnaire to complete in preparation for the workshop.

### *The Workshop: May 14 9am-12pm*

You will attend a **half day** (9-12) training May 14 via ZOOM (UNT's video conferencing tool) where a cross disciplinary team of experienced faculty members will coach you through the creation of your portfolio.

### *The "Work": May 14-23*

You will "meet" with one of the mentor team members for **two follow up sessions** to work on your portfolio. You will submit your work via Canvas and receive feed back both written and via Zoom from your mentor.

### *The Big Reveal: May 24*

Your portfolio will be showcased at our Big Reveal on May 24 at noon for all teaching portfolio attendees, their department chairs, mentorship team and other university administrators. You can attend this session virtually or in person at Willis Library. Lunch will be provided for those attending IRL (In Real Life).
