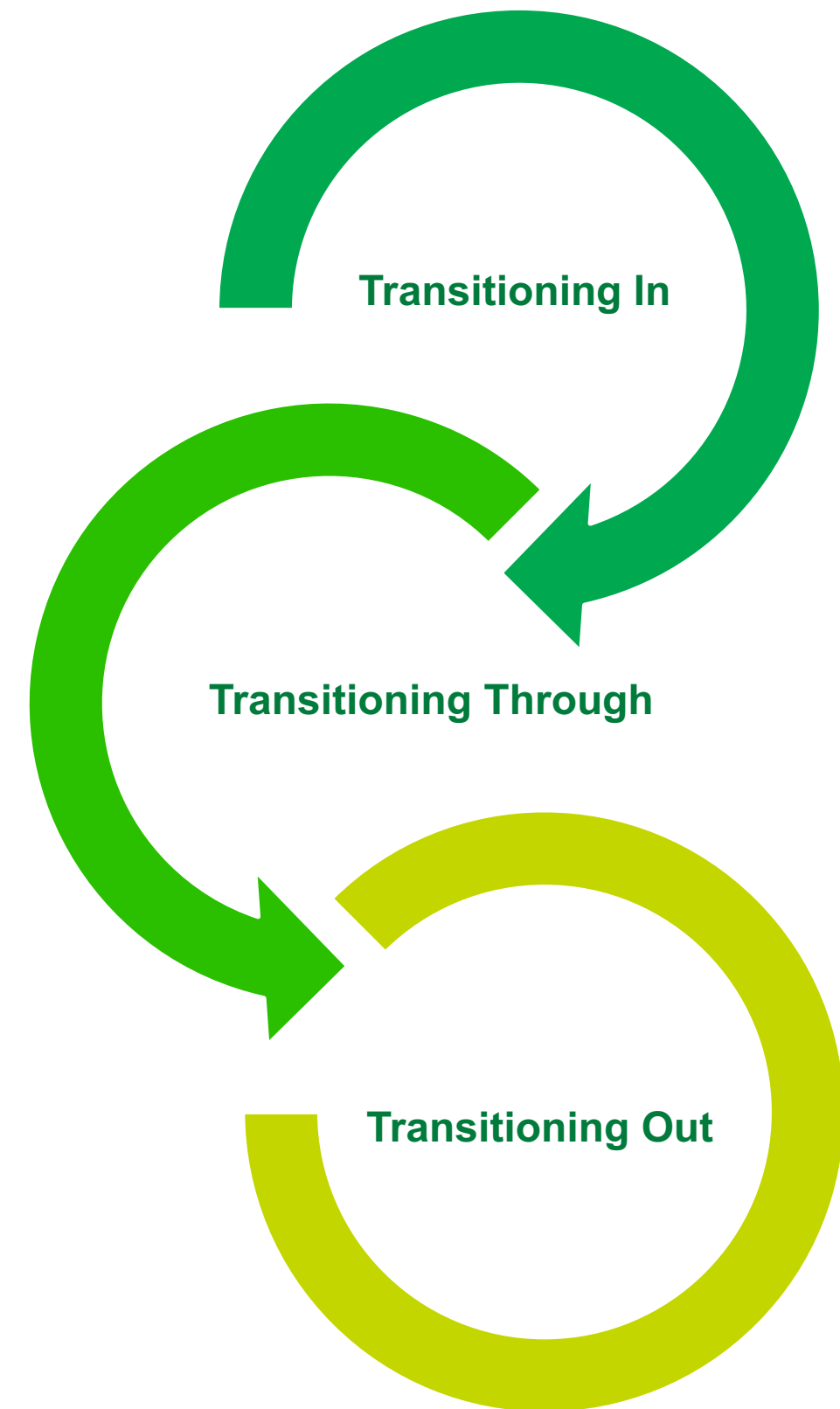
## 02. Mission

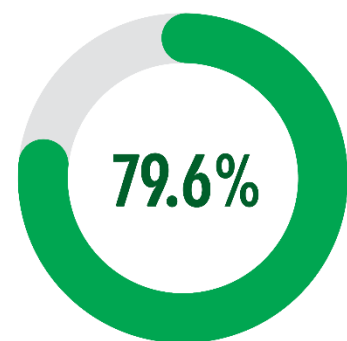

Number of **UNT students** who reported the services received at CTS helped them stay enrolled compared to **peer institutions nationally**.<sup>1</sup>

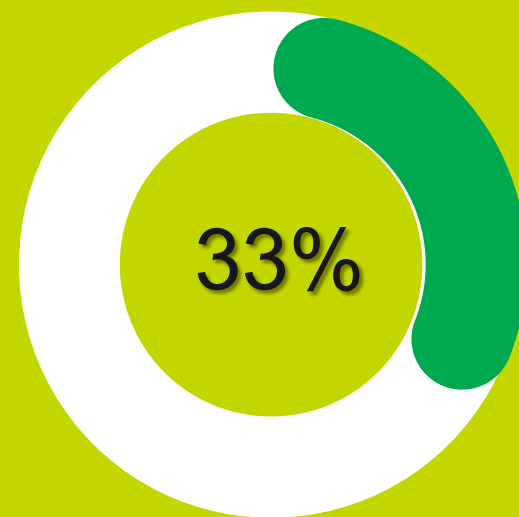


Number of **UNT students** who reported the counseling received improved the quality of their college experience.

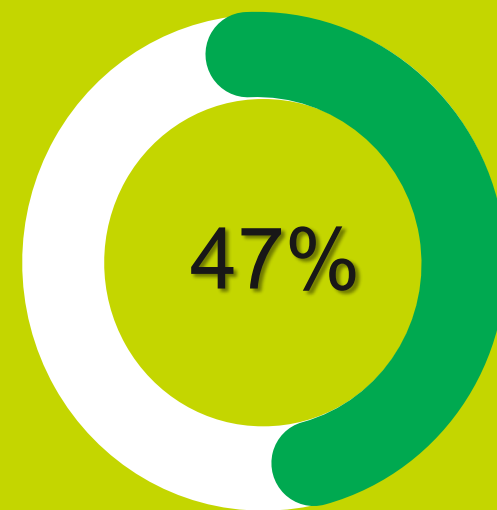

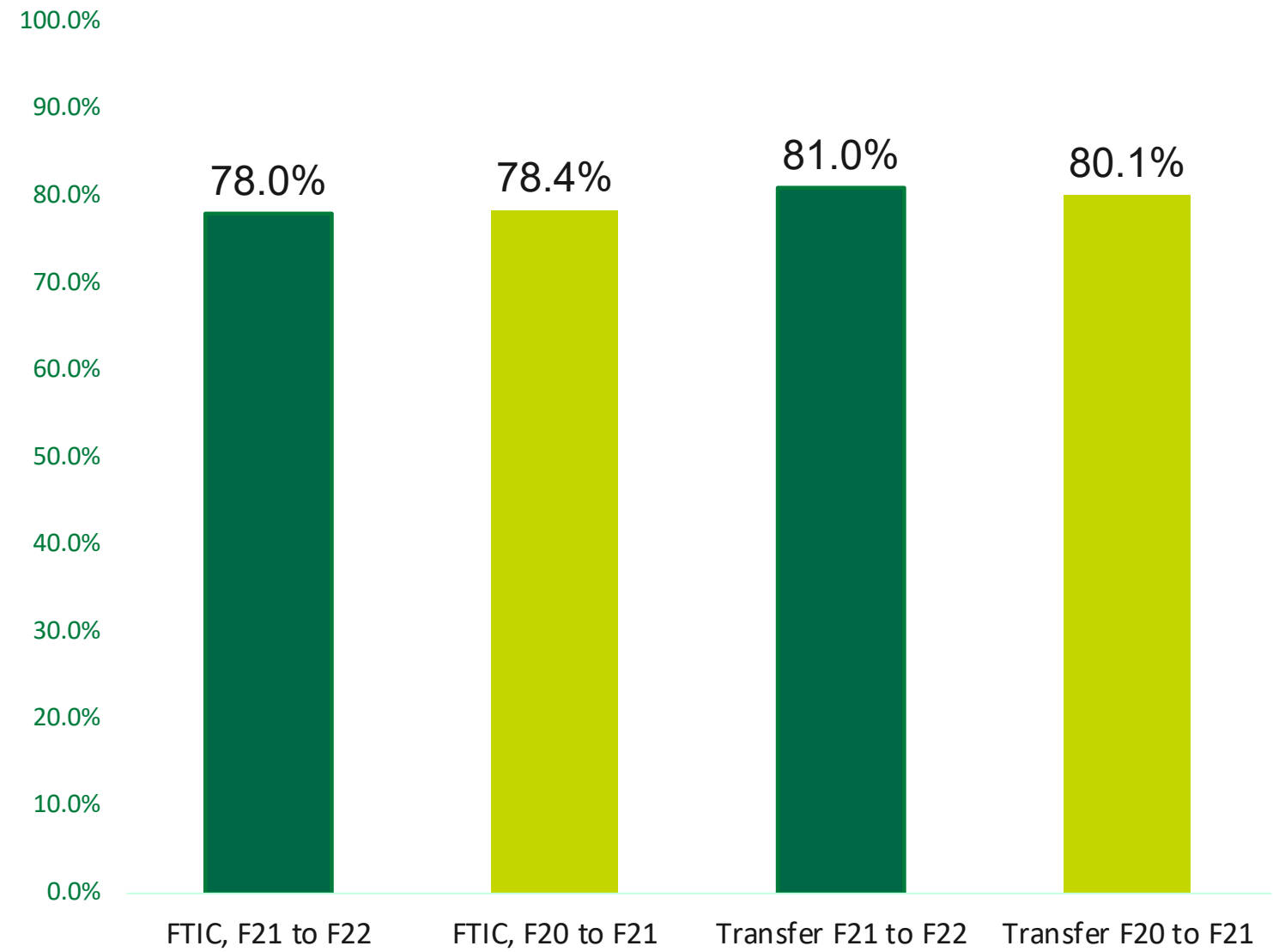

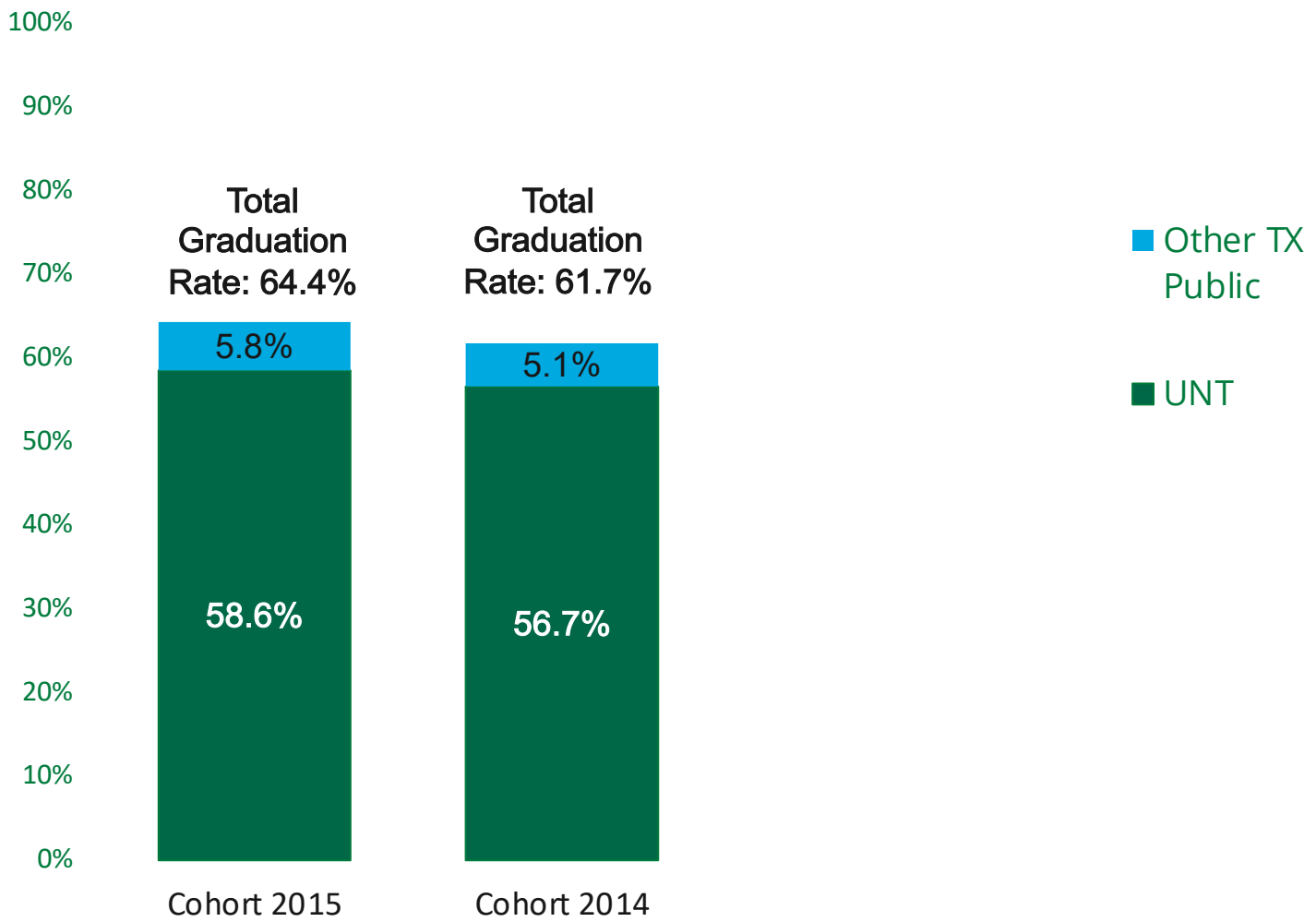
